The strongest-smelling and strongest-tasting whiskies. They tend to be medium-bodied, dry and phenolic (smoky or medicinal). Much of the Isle of Islay is peat, and this taints the water. Some distilleries avoid this by using spring water, some use heavily peated malt to reinforce this.
